Notes from presentation to PAC on Helping children and youth cope with Anxiety

Anxious children tend to over-estimate how likely an unpleasant event will actually happen and how bad the consequences will be.

When is anxiety a problem? - Doesn't go away - Causes distress - Is excessive or out of proportion - Is inappropriate for age - Stops child from engaging in activities - The child has a hard time settling back to normal state.

The Number One goal is to help the child face his/her fears in order to overcome those fears / Fighting the Fear by Facing the Fear

Tips to help your anxious child:

Regular meal times and healthy, nutritious snacks. Limit sugar-rich or caffeine-rich foods Exercise as a means for relieving stress, improving energy and reducing worry. Sleep... we are all much more emotionally reactive when tired! Regular bedtime and bedtime routines. Review positive events/ Maintain a calm and relaxed environment. Facilitate social interactions...Play Dates! Encourage non-competitive games Prepare child for changes in routine and practice new routines. Don't be emotionally reactive and Don't be late! Be mindful of subtle avoidance or distractions Limit and monitor screen time Acknowledge Feelings: "I remember that you felt worried last time but then you did it and that feeling went away" etc. Avoid giving excessive reassurance because it feeds the anxiety.

You want to encourage the child to feel empowered...that they can do it! If they are over-controlled or protected, it gives them the message that the world is a scary and dangerous place and that they are not capable of coping.

This month's short feature presentation is by Sarah McLaughlin, Lansdowne's teacher/librarian, on the work she does with our kids to foster literacy as well as tips for parents to support literacy at home. The key is to recognize when a child's anxiety is unduly interfering with his or her life such that intervention of some kind is warranted. Melinda noted that anxiety issues are well researched, and that there are a range of effective resources available, many of which Melinda has access to, and can share with parents and students. Satisfaction Survey information is used as part of our planning processes as we strive for ongoing improvement to our school.

LMS Students Compete in Skills Canada Competition

Three teams of grade 8 students were proud to represent Lansdowne at the Skills Canada Competition at Camosun College Interurban Campus.

Out of twenty teams, only four teams created spaghetti bridges that were able to hold a 1 kg weight for 60 seconds. Most bridges blew up right away - but ours didn't. I'm proud to announce that the second, third, and fourth place teams were the 3 Lansdowne teams. The first place team created a lighter bridge, which was why they won the official competition. But just for fun, we added more weight, and when it came to holding 1.5 kg, their bridge broke, while none of the Lansdowne bridges did. All three Lansdowne teams created bridges which held the 1.5 kg weight for a full minute – and they were the only teams to do this. Amazing!

I feel proud of these grade 8 students and was impressed by their teamwork.





Volunteer Drivers -Criminal Record Check will be Required by September, 2014

Volunteers are an important part of our school community. By generously donating time and expertise to our school, volunteer drivers support the learning environment for our students, especially transporting students for class fieldtrips and extracurricular sports.

Our school district is committed to ensuring student safety. With this in mind, drivers who are volunteering to drive any child other than their own will be required to complete a Criminal Record Check (CRC) and Driver's Abstract beginning in the fall of 2014.

If you can help:

- Complete our school's "Volunteer Driver Form" and provide a copy of your Driver's License and insurance.
- Phone ICBC to get a copy of your Driver's Abstract. Go to the following link to get the phone number for the ICBC office near you: <u>http://icbc.com/driver-licensing/driving-record</u>. Once you receive your Driver's Abstract in the mail, please bring it to the school office.
- Apply online for a Criminal Record Check at https://justice.gov.bc.ca/eCRC/ home.htm. Use our school's access code: 06161036.* Your Criminal Record Check will be sent directly to the school.

Criminal Record Check applicants who do not have a credit history of at least six months or have not been living in Canada for at least two years will need to get a Volunteer Driver Letter from the school office to take it to your municipal police department.

If you will possibly be volunteering as a driver for school fieldtrips, extracurricular sports, or other school-related activities next year, <u>we strongly encourage you to</u> <u>complete this process now</u> so you are able to be a driver for our students by this fall. We greatly appreciate all of our volunteer drivers taking the time to complete this process. For further information, please contact the school office.

* The Criminal Record Review Program verifies identities through an Electronic Identity Verification (EIV) process. It is important to know that the Criminal Records Review Program is not running a credit report; it is only using the EIV to verify the applicant's identity and to make sure the personal information contained in the criminal record check form is accurate. No information from this process is retained or stored by the Criminal Record Check Program.

Student Class Placement for 2014-15

Lansdowne Middle School staff will soon be working on tentative placements of students for next year. If you have any information you would like to share or requests you would like to make regarding the placement of your son or daughter, please submit this in writing (letter or e-mail) to Mr. Andrews – kandrews@sd61.bc.ca – by April 30, 2014. We will attempt to



incorporate your suggestions into our plans. Your letter or email should outline educational reasons, not just teacher preference. There will be situations where it will not be possible to accommodate all requests because of the many factors involved in trying to build the best possible educational experience for all students. Among the factors we consider are: peer relationships; the child's social, emotional, physical, and intellectual needs; balancing the number of boys and girls in a class; providing enriched opportunities



and remedial support; balancing numbers of students between classes; and trying to create the most advantageous overall educational setting possible for all students. We try to accommodate all requests received by April 30th. It is much more difficult to accommodate any requests received once the class-building process has begun. We will begin class building in May, but all lists will be considered temporary until later in September when we can confirm numbers and staffing.

Concours d'art oratoire

Félicitations! Congratulations to all of the courageous students who participated in this year's Concours d'art oratoire, the French Immersion Public Speaking Competition (school level), that was held at Lansdowne on Tuesday, March 4th. It was an inspiring event that brought all of the French Immersion classes together. All students had written and presented their own speech in front of their own class as a class project.
