Lansdowne PAC Seeking Parent Volunteers for Summer Naturescape Watering

Over the past few years, a major initiative of Lansdowne's PAC has been the installation of a Naturescape in the back of the school, featuring an outdoor stage, cedar benches, pathways, and garden beds of indigenous plants and trees. Lansdowne's students and staff have been involved in creating the vision and planting the garden beds. Teachers and students will be caring for these beds over the final months of the school year and again in the Fall. Meanwhile, we are looking for parent volunteers to take a summer shift - e.g. volunteer to hand-water the Naturescape using the hose already in place during one week of the summer (likely twice during your week). No gardening expertise is needed; it's not onerous and we will provide you with the watering instructions you need as well as a contact person should any questions or concerns arise.

Grade 8 Transition Afternoon

Thursday, May 15 is District Transition afternoon. All current grade 8 students will be going to their high school for an orientation assembly and tour of the school. Students will attend presentations, be led on a tour and have an opportunity to learn more about the school and its programs.

Grade 8 students will be **dismissed early (at 12:11)** to allow students time to travel to their 2014-15 high school. All grade 8's are expected to visit their intended 2014-15 high school for the afternoon. Students attending other high schools are expected to check in with the school counselor when they arrive. At the end of the afternoon, students will be dismissed directly from the high school they are visiting around 2:45pm and they are not expected to return to Lansdowne.

Students are responsible for making their own way to their respective high schools after our 12:11 dismissal as well as making their own way home from the high school after they are dismissed please discuss with your child how they will return home (i.e. Parent pick up, bus, walk, etc.).

Please remind your child that he/she is making a first impression at high school. We trust that he/she will have a responsible and respectful attitude at all times during the visit.

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Volunteer Drivers -Criminal Record Check will be Required by September, 2014

Volunteers are an important part of our school community. By generously donating time and expertise to our school, volunteer drivers support the learning environment for our students, especially transporting students for class fieldtrips and extracurricular sports.

Our school district is committed to ensuring student safety. With this in mind, drivers who are volunteering to drive any child other than their own will be required to complete a Criminal Record Check (CRC) and Driver's Abstract beginning in the fall of 2014.

If you can help:

- Complete our school's "Volunteer Driver Form" and provide a copy of your Driver's License and insurance.
- Phone ICBC to get a copy of your Driver's Abstract. Go to the following link to get the phone number for the ICBC office near you: http://icbc.com/driver-licensing/driving-record. Once you receive your Driver's Abstract in the mail, please bring it to the school office.
- Apply online for a Criminal Record Check at https://justice.gov.bc.ca/eCRC/
 home.html. Use our school's access code: MLCHHTWT8Z.* Your Criminal Record Check will be sent directly to the school.

Criminal Record Check applicants who do not have a credit history of at least six months or have not been living in Canada for at least two years will need to get a Volunteer Driver Letter from the school office to take it to your municipal police department.

If you will possibly be volunteering as a driver for school fieldtrips, extracurricular sports, or other school-related activities next year, we strongly encourage you to complete this process now so you are able to be a driver for our students by this fall. We greatly appreciate all of our volunteer drivers taking the time to complete this process. For further information, please contact the school office.

^{*} The Criminal Record Review Program verifies identities through an Electronic Identity Verification (EIV) process. It is important to know that the Criminal Records Review Program is not running a credit report; it is only using the EIV to verify the applicant's identity and to make sure the personal information contained in the criminal record check form is accurate. No information from this process is retained or stored by the Criminal Record Check Program.
