Textbook Deposit Returns



Every year the school loses thousands of dollars in lost and damaged books. Unfortunately, the \$20 book deposit only covers a fraction of the costs of lost and damaged books (one textbook alone can cost \$80 to replace). So please help us save valuable funds and teach social responsibility by insisting that your child return all his or her school books. If your child tells you his/her book(s) has gone missing and can't be found, please help him/her look carefully for it at home and be sure it gets returned to the school. If your child is departing Lansdowne at the end of the school year and you paid an initial book deposit and all books have been returned, your \$20 deposit will be available in cash for parental pick-up from the school office during the final week of school (June 23 to 26) and during the following school week (June 30, July 2 and 3). Another reminder notice will be put in grade 8 students' report card envelopes. Funds from any unclaimed deposits will be greatly appreciated by the school, and used to offset the high costs we face for lost and damaged books. Curriculum Completion Day Monday, June 9th

All ten middle schools in the Greater Victoria School District schedule 1.4 Curriculum Completion Days during each school year. These days are intended to provide additional time and opportunity for students with overdue or unsatisfactory school assignments to successfully complete their school work prior to each report card.

Lansdowne's final Curriculum Completion session will run from 11:40 a.m. to 2:50 p.m. on Monday, June 9.

Advisory teachers **sent home a letter on Wednesday, June 4**th informing families whether a child is required or *not* required to attend the CC session. Should this requirement change prior to June 9th, you will receive a phone call from your child's advisory teacher.

On this CC day, all students are expected to come to school in the morning as usual. Beginning at 11:40 a.m., students required to attend will be organized into various locations to complete overdue or unsatisfactory assignments under the supervision of teachers and educational assistants. Students who are *not* required to stay for the CC session will be dismissed at 11:40 a.m. unless we hear from you that you would like your child to stay at school even though current requirements are being met; in that case, s/he will be provided with a quiet and supervised location to read and/or work quietly. More detailed information was provided in the letter sent home in advance of this CC session.
