Future PAC meeting plans (Craig):

- Consider ongoing Zoom meetings, in person meetings, or hybrid to allow maximum participation.
  - (Carter) Small in person meetings would be allowed in school, but as COVID restrictions and guidelines continue to evolve it would be prudent to assess closer to the date of next meeting.
  - (General discussion) For a hybrid model (Zoom and In-person), technology support would be required. Administration agrees to support PAC to meet needs where able.

Treasurer's report (Whitney):

Administration Report (Carter Giesbrecht, Hilary Braid-Skolski, Alissa Moore):

-730 students enrolled at this time

-Sports have begun again; team working hard to iron out communication, COVID considerations, pick-up/drop-off, etc.

-COVID protocols/plans: goal had been to reassess at end of Sept (re-examine numbers, current situation in community/province), but this has not been able to occur provincially yet.

- Sports to continue at this time; recommendations may change in future
- Masks likely to continue for year
- In near future we should all be appraised by PHO as to new plan re communication/notification re exposures, etc. School will follow their instructions.

-Garbage in/Garbage out philosophy within school; programs re waste/compost/recycle are always evolving and continue to present a challenge. Staff community involved in planning and solutions.

-Gradeless Reporting pilot project:

- This was discussed in June 2021 meeting also
- Assessment practice will remain, but grades replaced with language of growth and support
  Four-point system: emerging, developing, proficient, or extending
- Ministry of Education will implement this assessment system across the province for 2022/23 school year LMS and Cedar Hill Middle School
- 2 middle schools in D61 are participating in pilot this year: LMS and Cedar Hill
- There are 27 elementary schools in D61—12 of which are participating this year
- Ministry and School Districts working to familiarize teachers with this reporting style and will be supporting one another through pilot year.

General Discussion:

- First Lego League (FLL), many sport opportunities throughout year, Gay Straight Alliance (GSA)
- Each school year the offerings are a result of teacher/parent interest and ability and these will emerge in the coming weeks or over the course of the year. There has been a drama club, a sewing club, and others.
