GRADE 8 TRANSITION AFTERNOON

Thursday, May 16 is district transition afternoon. All current grade 8 students will be going to their high school for an orientation assembly and tour of the school. Students will attend presentations, be led on a tour and have an opportunity to learn more about the school and its programs.

Grade 8 students will be **dismissed early (at 11:40)** to allow students time to travel to their 2024-25 high school. All grade 8's are expected to visit their intended 2024-25 high school for the afternoon. Most schools are asking that students arrive by 12:45. (An email will be sent by secondary schools.) At the end of the afternoon, students will be dismissed directly from the high school they are visiting around 2:45pm and they are not expected to return to Lansdowne.

Students are responsible for making their own way to their respective high schools after our 11:40pm dismissal as well as making their own way home from the high school after they are dismissed—please discuss with your child how they will return home (i.e. Parent pick up, bus, walk, etc.).
