GRADE 8 TRANSITION AFTERNOON

Thursday, May 15 is district transition afternoon. All current grade 8 students will be going to their high school for an orientation assembly and tour of the school. Students will attend presentations, be led on a tour and have an opportunity to learn more about the school and its programs.

Grade 8 students will be **dismissed early (at 11:40)** to allow students time to travel to their 2025-26 high school. All grade 8's are expected to visit their intended 2025-26 high school for the afternoon. Most schools are asking that students arrive by 12:45. (An email will be sent by secondary schools.) At the end of the afternoon, students will be dismissed directly from the high school they are visiting around 2:45pm and they are not expected to return to Lansdowne.

If your child is on the waitlist for a transfer, they should go to the school they are currently scheduled to attend.

Students are responsible for making their own way to their respective high schools after our 11:40pm dismissal as well as making their own way home from the high school after they are dismissed—please discuss with your child how they will return home (i.e. Parent pick up, bus, walk, etc.).

Signing up for local and provincial communications and using alerting applications will help you stay informed and enhance your ability to respond effectively and plan for emergencies.
- **Make a plan** You and your family may not be together at the same place when a disaster strikes so it's important to include your family, relatives, and friends in your planning process. Practice and review your plan annually.

Build your emergency kit – You may be without power or safe drinking water during an emergency. Be prepared to be self-sufficient for at least 72 hours in an emergency. Build an emergency kit to suit your and your family's needs including pets. Involve your family and children in building the emergency kit.
