GRADE 8 TRANSITION AFTERNOON

Thursday, May 14 is district transition afternoon. All current grade 8 students will be going to their high school for an orientation assembly and tour of the school. Students will attend presentations, be led on a tour and have an opportunity to learn more about the school and its programs.

Grade 8 students will be **dismissed early (at 11:40)** to allow students time to travel to their 2026-27 high school. All grade 8's are expected to visit their intended 2026-2027 high school for the afternoon. Most schools are asking that students arrive by 12:45. (An email will be sent by secondary schools.) At the end of the afternoon, students will be dismissed directly from the high school they are visiting around 2:45pm and they are not expected to return to Lansdowne.



If your child is on the waitlist for a transfer, they should go to the school they are currently scheduled to attend.

Students are responsible for making their own way to their respective high schools after our 11:40pm dismissal as well as making their own way home from the high school after they are dismissed—please discuss with your child how they will return home (i.e. Parent pick up, bus, walk, etc.).

Week 1: Theatre & Nature with Treena Stubel, AGES 6-10

July 6-10 | 9:00 AM - 12:00 PM

Week 2: Creating Characters with Treena Stubel, AGES 6-10

Week 3: Puppetry Intensive (with Jen Percy-Edwards and Treena Stubel) AGES 8-12

A special full-day camp focused on puppetry and object theatre. Students will create characters, build simple puppets, and develop original scenes using movement, imagination, and ensemble play.

Week 4: Physical Storytelling with Treena Stubel, AGES 6-10

August 17-21 | 9:00 AM - 12:00 PM

Explore how stories can be told through the body. Through movement, gesture, and imagination, students will create dynamic scenes, build ensemble awareness, and discover new ways to express ideas without relying on words.
